## **A NOTE FROM FR. LARRY**

1 – Perhaps the biggest local news of the week is that Kathleen Schneck has been selected as the new Principal of St. Joseph the Workers Catholic Academy (SJWCA). Ms. Schneck is a graduate of St. Anthony's Catholic High School in Huntington, Hofstra University (BS), Vermont College of Fine Arts (MFA), and Hunter College of the City University of New York (Advanced Certificate in School Administration). She comes to SJWCA with many years of award-winning teaching and related leadership experience in public and charter school environments. I join the pastors of the other nearby parishes aligned with SJWCA (and indeed the entire SJWCA community of students, teachers, Board members, parents and supporters) in welcoming Ms. Schneck and wishing her all of God's blessings in her new position.

2 – Many thanks to Kathleen McDonagh and colleagues for organizing the simple but beautiful devotion to Our Lady of Knock before and after our 5:30 PM Vigil Mass last Saturday evening (just two days short of the 138<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Our Blessed Mother's appearance in the town of Knock, Ireland on August 21, 1879). Kathleen and the other organizers linked their Knock devotion to protection of the right to life by including the laying of a rose and a prayer at the Memorial to the victims of abortion in the Grotto outside the front of the Church.

3 – Saturday, August 19<sup>th</sup> was also the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the fourth apparition of Our Lady to the children at Fatima in Portugal. (Our Lady appeared to the children in Fatima six times in 1917.) Thanks to the generosity of the Reselosa family, we were able to have their statue of Our Lady of Fatima in the Church at all of our weekend Masses, and to offer as a community brief prayers after each Mass asking for Our Lady's intercession in reducing tension, terrorism, violence, hatred, and bias and increasing a sense of peace both here at home and abroad.

4 – Please see the information elsewhere in this bulletin about the Brooklyn Diocese's Catholic Day at Citifield on Saturday, September 9, 2017 and Sign-Ups for Season Three of the ARISE Together in Christ program at our weekend Masses on September 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>/17<sup>th</sup>. The day at Citifield will be filled with both faith (Mass and opportunities for Confession) and fun (music, activities, food, the evening Mets game). The ARISE program has proven to be a great source of spiritual enrichment and community-building here at Holy Name and many other parishes throughout the Diocese.

*A REFLECTION ON THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL (Matthew 16:13-20)*

### **“The Rock on which the Church is built**

In the [Gospel](#) Reading, Christ tells Peter that Peter is the rock on which Christ will found his church. And, Jesus promises, the gates of hell will not prevail against this rock or against the church built on it. This is a comforting thought, isn't it? In the darkness of the world, there is something—the apostle Peter, the Church—that evil cannot wreck! The problem is that it so often looks as if the gates of hell *have* prevailed against Christ's church.

### **The Church is not a collection of the sinless, and it was not meant to be.**

Actually, the problem begins with Peter. The apostle, who was supposed to be the rock of the Church, betrayed the Lord he loved in his Lord's worst need. A betrayal like that seems to have something hellish about it, doesn't it? As far as that goes, how does Peter differ from Judas? Judas betrayed Christ too, of course. In fact, the Gospel of John says that Satan entered into Judas before he went to the Pharisees to conspire with them to get Jesus ([John 13:27](#)). There is certainly something hellish about the treachery of Judas if Satan entered into him. So why not think that the gates of hell prevailed against Peter too, in *his* betrayal of Christ? What is left of Jesus' promise that the gates of Hell will not prevail against Peter or against Christ's Church?

But notice that there *is* a difference between Judas and Peter.

You might think the difference is that Peter repented and Judas didn't. But there you would be mistaken. The Gospel of Matthew makes it clear that Judas repented, too ([Matthew 27:3](#)). So, here is the real difference between them. When Judas saw the sin of his betrayal for what it was, he killed himself. He threw himself away as hopeless, as irredeemable. But Peter came back to Christ. He cleaved to the Lord he loved even in the face of his own betrayal of him.

And that is why Peter is the rock on which the Church is founded. The Church is not a collection of the sinless, and it was not meant to be. The Church was founded on Peter, who loved, and sinned, and held on to the Lord anyway. The gates of Hell cannot prevail against this kind of love. This *is* a deeply comforting thought.” (by *Eleonore Stump, Professor of Philosophy, St. Louis U., from Spirituality section of the St. Louis U. Sunday Website for August 21, 2017*).

## **What is ARISE Together in Christ?**

ARISE Together in Christ is a program from Renew International providing a parish spiritual renewal and evangelization process. The goal is to help people become better hearers and doers of the Word of God by encouraging and supporting the formation of small communities as sharing groups where individuals seek to grow in faith and in their relationship with God and one another.

The ARISE process invited us to make a six week journey each Fall and Spring, for a total of five seasons. We will explore key scriptural themes and connect them with living out our Catholic faith. Participants will meet weekly in a faith sharing group of 8-12 individuals either in homes or at the parish.

## **ARISE Typical Meeting Agenda**

In ARISE, small faith-sharing groups meet seeking to grow in faith and their relationship with God and one another. Meetings are held in homes or on the parish campus. Each Season of ARISE meets once a week for only six weeks and each session lasts approximately 90 minutes. The meetings include:

- Introductions
- Opening Prayer
- Reflecting on Our Story
- Scripture Reading
- Sharing
- Reflecting on the Reading
- Invitation to Act
- Closing Prayer

## What is ARISE?

**ARISE TOGETHER IN CHRIST** is run by **RENEW INTERNATIONAL** and has been in 150 dioceses in the United States and in 25 different countries – About 75 parishes in Brooklyn and Queens have already signed up.

ARISE is small groups of faith sharing based on scripture and held in the parish or homes. It is five 6-week seasons over 3 years to meet once a week for 1 ½ hours beginning in early October 2016. One season will be in the fall and another season will be in the spring.

The ARISE Team will be signing people up during the weekends of September 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>/17<sup>th</sup> for small groups. There will be a trained facilitator for each group. 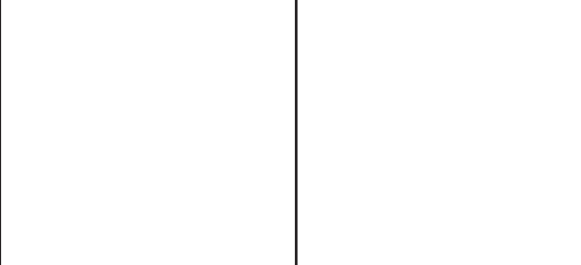
