

The Diocese of Brooklyn and Holy Name of Jesus Parish need your help with the **2020 Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA)**. The COVID 19 crisis put continuing extraordinary demands upon the network of Diocesan services supported by the Appeal. For example, Diocesan Catholic Charities has been serving over 100,000 meals daily across the Diocese, a 300% increase over previous years. There are 30 hospital chaplains deployed throughout the Diocese ministering to the most vulnerable. Our educators had to quickly implement innovative distance learning tools to continue the religious formation of our Catholic youth. Parishes have been livestreaming Masses and making increased use of social media to maintain connectivity with the faithful.

Funds donated through the Annual Catholic Appeal play a critical role in enabling the Diocese to continue these initiatives. Donations to the Appeal are also critically important to individual parishes like Holy Name of Jesus because any dollars donated over the Diocesan goal come back to the parish. Here at Holy Name, all of those "over goal" dollars are used to reduce our still quite large debt obligations.

2020 has been a year of extraordinary demands in a time of economic uncertainty. Fundraising has been difficult. I am very grateful to the 107 parishioners and friends of HNJ parish who have already pledged and paid \$53,354 to the 2020 Appeal. Thanks to those parishioners and friends, HNJ parish has just met its Diocesan goal of \$52,974. However, last year we had 221 parishioners who pledged and paid \$112,831 to the 2019 Appeal. We are still about \$60,000 (and 114 donors) away from where we were at the end of the 2019 Appeal. Failure to close that gap will have a serious financial impact on the parish.

The Diocese has designated June 27-28 as a Virtual Commitment Weekend. The theme for the 2020 Appeal is **WE ARE THE CHURCH, TOGETHER**. Please help us in demonstrating that theme by considering a gift to the Appeal.

## A Note From Fr. Larry

### REOPENING OF CHURCH FOR PUBLIC MASSES WITH CONGREGATIONS

The big news is that Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio has announced that **churches in the Diocese of Brooklyn can re-open for public Mass, with COVID-19 safety protocols in place.**

**Starting Monday, June 29**, we will resume our regular schedule of public Masses in Holy Name of Jesus Church:

**Monday - Saturday: 9 a.m.**  
**Saturday Vigil: 5:30 p.m.**  
**Sunday: 7:30 a.m., 9 a.m. (Spanish), 10:30 a.m., and Noon**

**Everyone who enters Holy Name must adhere to social distancing directives.** These are in place for your own protection as well as that of others:

- For all Masses: please enter through:
  - the Main Doors at the top of the **center** steps on Prospect Park West,
  - the glass-paneled door on Prospect Park West, at the top of the short flight of steps between the Church and the Rectory,
  - the Side Door from the parking lot, or
  - the Ramp Door on Prospect Avenue.
- Please observe social distancing at all times and keep at least 6 feet from others, whether outside or inside the Church. Stay at least 6 feet behind the person entering / leaving before you.
- On Sundays, the Church doors may be closed and entry delayed for a few minutes between Masses to allow time for cleaning and sanitizing.
- You **must** wear a mask or cloth face covering in the Church, even during Mass. Please bring your own if at all possible.
- Social Distancing and capacity guidelines have greatly reduced available seating in the Church. When you enter, please follow the ushers' guidance to help us to maximize our use of the available seats, and fill the seats from "the front to the rear." Members of same household may sit together. Appropriate seating spacing has been marked. Plans are being made to accommodate "overflow" in Shepherds' Hall, if necessary.
- As you exit the Church on Sundays, follow the ushers' guidance about which exits to use. Please do not congregate outside Church after exiting; maintain social distancing from others who are leaving as well as those who are waiting to attend the next Mass.
- The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass remains in effect until further notice. Therefore, if you are health-compromised, have a temperature above 100 degrees, or are feeling ill in any way, we must ask you to stay home. We will continue to livestream our Monday-Friday 9 a.m. and our Sunday 9 a.m.(Spanish) and 10:30 am (English) Masses on our parish Facebook and web pages.
- **The reception of Communion will be different.** It is **strongly recommended the faithful receive Holy Communion in the hand.** You must leave your mask on when you approach the priest, deacon or Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist. When you receive the Sacred Host, you should move to the side and consume the Eucharist immediately, then return to your seat. Communion will only be offered in one form; the Precious Blood will not be distributed to the faithful at this time.
- Holy Name will now be open for individual prayer from 10 a.m. to Noon, Monday through Saturday.
- Confessions will continue to be heard in the Rectory by appointment.

(Father's Day) for all fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, uncles, and all men who help in the role of father. Thank you and God bless you all.

Last Friday evening, I viewed the annual **Chrism Mass** on NET TV. The principal celebrant was Bishop DiMarzio, who this year celebrated his 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary as a priest. The Chrism Mass is usually celebrated during Holy Week, but had to be postponed until June 19 because of COVID 19. It is the Mass at which the Bishop blesses the Holy Oils used for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders, and the Anointing of the Sick. It is also the Mass at which diocesan priests and deacons renew the promises they made on their ordination day.

This Saturday, June 27, **Bishop DiMarzio will ordain four new priests for the Diocese of Brooklyn**. Our congratulations to Fathers Néstor Martínez, Peter Okajima, Gabriel Agudelo-Perdomo, Dragan Pusic and to their families and loved ones.

Normally hundreds of priests and deacons would attend the Chrism and Ordination Masses. That is not possible during this year that is so far from normal. However, viewing both these major liturgies so closely together reminds me (and, I believe, many other priests) in a special way of the great privilege and great responsibility we have been given to serve as Christ's ministers to His people. †
