## A NOTE FROM FR. LARRY

Last Saturday, November 5, I had the privilege of baptizing Zackary Lee Pynn here in Holy Name Church. We welcome Zack as our newest Catholic Christian, and congratulate him, his parents, and his large, extended family.

This week, we are mailing out Entry Forms (Raffle Tickets) and a calendar showing the daily prizes for our 2022 Holidays Jackpot Raffle. Entry forms are also available in this bulletin, in the rear of the Church, and in the Rectory office. The Jackpot has \$7,500 in cash prizes, ranging from \$100 to \$1,000, as detailed on the calendar, and you have 38 chances to win for each entry you submit. Daily drawings start Thanksgiving Day, November 24 and end on New Year's Eve, December 31. If you win on one day, your Entry Form will be returned to the drum so that you have opportunities to win again. After the prizes are awarded, all proceeds will be used by HNJ Parish to help our Fundraising efforts that are still not yet recovered from the negative impact of COVID. Submit your completed Entry Form(s), and the Entry Fee of \$50 per form, to the Rectory Office by Wednesday, November 23, to ensure you have the most opportunities to win. Thank you for supporting this important fundraiser for the parish.

In 2017, Pope Francis directed that each year, the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time also be observed as World Day of the Poor. Pope Francis' Message for this year's Sixth World Day of the Poor was

based on the Scriptural verses "Jesus Christ...for [our] sakes became poor, so that by his poverty [we] might become rich" (cf. 2 Corinthians: 8-9). In his message, Pope Francis included the following excerpt from a homily from the great Father and Doctor of the Church, St. John Chrysostom: "If you are unable to believe that poverty can make you rich, think of your Lord and stop doubting. Had he not been poor, you would not be rich. Here is something astonishing: poverty has become the source of abundant wealth. What Paul means by 'wealth' ... is the knowledge of piety, purification from sin, justice, sanctification, and a thousand other good things that have been given us now and always. All these things we have thanks to poverty". Pope Francis himself explained: "The words of [St. Paul to the Corinthians] chosen as the theme of this year's World Day of the Poor present this great paradox of our life of faith: Christ's poverty makes us rich. Paul was able to present this teaching...because God himself, in his Son Jesus, chose to follow this path. Because Jesus became poor for our sakes, our own lives are illumined and transformed, and take on a worth the world does not appreciate and cannot bestow." Pope Francis also included the following important practical observation: "When the poor are concerned, it is not talk that matters; what matters is rolling up our sleeves and putting our faith into practice through a direct involvement, one that cannot be delegated."

## Looking More Closely at the Word

### EYES ON YOUR OWN PAPER

"Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place."

Looking at these words, I have to wonder. Am I reading the Bible or today's newspaper headline?

It's never easier to despair than when you glance up and take a good look at what's going on in the world: disasters, natural and contrived, wars, resentments, rivalries, and divisions. It is almost too much sometimes, isn't it?

The twenty-four-hour news cycle doesn't help. Add social media and it's enough to push anyone into a nervous breakdown.

When you find yourself in this place of despair, remember

Paul's admonishment in his letter to the Thessalonians. Work quietly and eat your own food.

It's not so different from the old "keep-your-eyes-on-your-own-paper" rule of the classroom. Poking our noses into other people's business, we may think we are getting a shortcut to the right answer, but we're really just getting distracted. When we become too preoccupied with events that we cannot control — whether they are happening in our neighborhood or half-a-world away — we are tempted to leave off the very specific work God has given us in our own lives. We are easily lured into anger, bitterness, and anxiety.

What is the work that God has called you to? Is it your career? Your family? Your community?

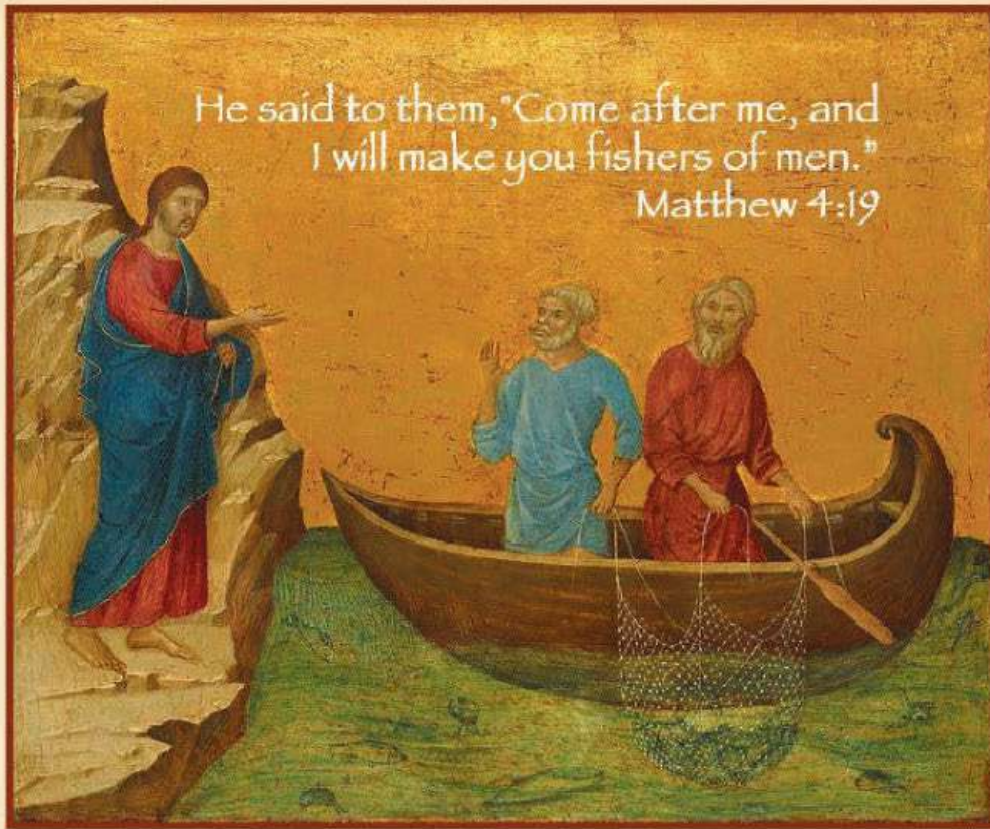
Our next food distributions will be:

## THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION MEMORIAL OF ALBERT THE GREAT

**November 15 — With passion, pursue the good:** You could say Saint Albert the Great was a real renaissance man, even though he died in 1289, before the Renaissance flourished. As a learned Dominican friar, he was an astute professor of philosophy, mentoring his famous pupil Thomas Aquinas and thus laying the groundwork for scholasticism. But Albert also wrote on other subjects he was passionate about: chemistry, physics, biology, astronomy, and geography—and served as bishop and theologian to the pope. “Knowledge of divine things is imprinted on our minds by union with God, who is Wisdom itself,” said Albert. Thank God for the good things you are passionate about, using them wisely to honor our Creator.
