A NOTE FROM FR. LARRY

We had a wonderful Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday) here in HNJ Parish. A total of 1,004 persons attended our Triduum Liturgies, which is a 12% increase over last year, and a far cry from the pandemic year of 2020 when Custodian John Murphy and I were alone in the Church. A high point of this year's Triduum was when Nataly Castillo received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. *Currents*, the news program for the Brooklyn Diocese's NET cable TV station, filmed parts of our Vigil Mass and later interviewed Nataly. Nataly has been an exemplary catechumen and member of the elect during her months of prayer and study to prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. We congratulate her and her family and we thank Deacon Gerry Devine and his wife, MaryRose, for the many hours they put into Nataly's preparation.

There are several other people I must thank. There are too many to do so by name, so I will do it by categories. Thank you to all the people who worked hard to clean and decorate the Church; who provided beautiful music by serving in the choirs; or who served as altar servers, lectors, or ministers of Holy Communion. Thank you to my fellow priests, to the Deacons, and to the Rectory staff for all your extra work during Holy Week and the Triduum. And of course, as always, thank you to the people of Holy Name of Jesus Parish, for your faith and your continuing support of this parish and me. I know that the Risen Lord will bless you and your loved ones.

This Sunday is both the Second Sunday of Easter and the Sunday of the Divine Mercy. There is an indulgence available for those who, on that day, take part in a devotion in honor of the Divine Mercy or who recite the Our Father, the Creed and a devout prayer to the Merciful Lord Jesus in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (either exposed or in the tabernacle). In a vision, Jesus told St. Faustina that those who had gone to Confession at a time reasonably before Divine Mercy Sunday (such as since the beginning of Lent) and who, still being in the state of grace, received Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday, would obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishments due to sin.

Please consider the following commentary on the relationship between Easter, this Sunday's Gospel

(St. John's account of the Risen Jesus appearing to the Apostles on the evening of the first Easter Sunday), and Divine Mercy Sunday:

"On this Sunday the Church celebrates the gift given to us to truly encounter Jesus in his sacraments. Divine Mercy Sunday is not a deviation from the joy of Easter; it is instead a celebration of that joy. Critics of the feast have said that it makes no sense after [the] penitential season of Lent. But it is indeed our celebration of Easter that makes Divine Mercy Sunday most powerful. The feast grew out of the visions of St. Faustina Kowalska. She experienced not a wispy, Ghostlike Jesus but a real person with whom she had conversations. The Jesus who rose from the dead is truly alive. He does not await his body at the end of time as we do. His transformation is complete and we see in him the promise of eternal life. It is that Jesus that offers us mercy and, in his very existence, shows us our future. ...The Gospel reading from St. John speaks of Jesus giving the power of the sacrament of Penance to the apostles. Cardinal Justin Rigali [then Archbishop of St. Louis] wrote in a 1998 pastoral letter to priests, 'The Scripture readings lend themselves to linking Easter and Divine Mercy since the texts highlight the forgiveness of sins. The disposition of trust in God's mercy is essential for receiving the graces God wants us to have.' "

Looking More Closely at the Word

REACHING OUT TO DIVINE MERCY

On Divine Mercy Sunday, Jesus reveals the good news of his mercy and invites us to trust in him.

Between 1931 and 1938, Jesus appeared in Poland to Sister Faustina Kowalska revealing to her that he wanted her to tell the whole world how much he wanted to show mercy to sinners. At the urging of her superiors, Sister Faustina kept a diary of her conversations with our Lord which was eventually published under the title, *Divine Mercy in My Soul*.

In one appearance, Jesus asked that the Sunday after Easter be celebrated as “Divine Mercy Sunday.” Jesus told Sister Faustina, “On the day of my feast, the feast of mercy, you will go through the world and bring fainting souls to the spring of my mercy. I shall heal and strengthen them” (*Divine Mercy in My Soul* #206).

And so, on April 30, 2000, Saint John Paul II honored our Lord’s request by declaring that the first Sunday after Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. Today’s gospel is especially fitting for this celebration.

If anyone was in need of mercy, it was Thomas. He wasn’t present when the Risen Jesus revealed himself to the other apostles. Because he didn’t see Jesus with his own eyes, he refused to believe.

The gospels do not tell us where Thomas was or what he was doing on that first Easter Sunday.

However, he was most likely walking the streets of Jerusalem listening to people talking about Jesus’ crucifixion. Some would have been saying how unjust it was. Others would have laughed at Jesus and his followers for be-


lieving in such nonsense. Whatever he was and whatever he was doing, the trauma of Jesus’ death was afflicting Thomas’ mind and heart. His spirit was crushed. He didn’t want to believe anymore.

Doesn’t this also describe the situation so many people find themselves in? We live in a time when people’s spirits are crushed. We experience much evil, deception, and cruelty in the world. Everywhere we turn we hear different opinions. We don’t know who to believe and begin to wonder what is true. We doubt, and like Thomas, we stray from the source of all truth — the Risen Christ and his Church. The longer we stay away, the deeper the roots of doubt sink within us. Eventually, we begin to lose hope.

That was the situation Thomas found himself in. He just could not bring himself to believe anymore. His heart was too broken.

How does Jesus react? Does he abandon Thomas to his fear and doubt? No. In his mercy, He appears to Thomas to relieve him of his burden of doubt, to heal his broken heart and to restore his faith.

That is what Jesus wants to do for us on Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus came to save sinners. He died on the cross so that all of us could find forgiveness. There is no sin so great that God cannot forgive it. And no one is so sinful that he or she cannot turn to Jesus and through his grace become a great saint. Jesus said as much to us through Sister Faustina when he said: “The greater the sinner, the more right he has to my mercy” (*Divine Mercy in My Soul* #723) All we need to do is reach out to touch the wounds of our Risen Lord, and we will experience his infinite mercy.
