THIS WEEK'S REFLECTION

THE JOURNEY OF FAITH HAS SURPRISING TWISTS

French missionary to the United States Simon Bruté, who died on June 26, 1839, lived through major upheaval. His father came from a wealthy, aristocratic family. His mother often told him, "You were born to live in opulence." But Bruté later wrote, "God ordered it otherwise." His father died deeply in debt and his affairs in disarray. His mother saved the boy from military service during France's Reign of Terror.

Disguised as a baker's assistant, he brought the Eucharist to imprisoned priests. He was eventually ordained, moved to Baltimore to teach, and later became the first bishop of the Diocese of Vincennes, Indiana. Life rarely turns out the way you plan, but if you surrender to God's will for you, you might find your faith takes you on an adventure you never could have imagined.

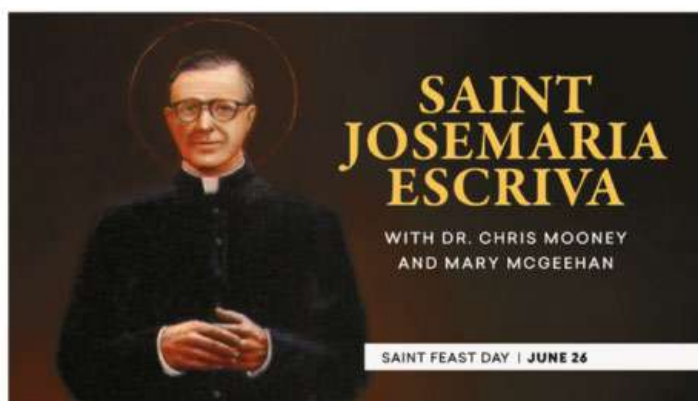
I’ll close with an update on the Eucharistic Revival. The three-year **National Eucharistic Revival** began on Corpus Christi Sunday in June of 2022. Year One was the Year of Diocesan Revival and included Eucharistic events throughout Brooklyn and Queens. One major

remaining Diocesan event will be the Brooklyn Diocese’s Eucharistic Revival celebration on Saturday, October 7, 2023 at Maimonides Park (Cyclones Stadium) in Coney Island in which all parishes are encouraged to participate. However, it is important to note that Year Two has been designated the Year of Parish Revival. It began just 10 days ago on Corpus Christi Sunday, June 11. During the next twelve months, there will be parish and Deanery (a group of nearby parishes) events and initiatives to help Catholics form deeper personal relationships with Jesus Christ through his Real Presence in the Eucharist. Among the earliest of those events were our outdoor Eucharistic processions on June 11 after the 10:30 Family Mass and on June 14 with the students and teachers of our aligned St. Joseph the Worker Catholic Academy. Planning is underway for additional parish-level events. Year Three of the Revival will be the Year of the National Eucharistic Congress to be held in Indianapolis, IN from July 17-21, 2024. †
