A NOTE FROM FR. LARRY

Congratulations again to the Honorees and organizers of last Sunday's **Brooklyn/Park Slope St. Patrick's Parade**. Many thanks to Auxiliary Bishop Auxiliary Mroziewski and to all who helped with the beautiful Pre-Parade Mass in HNJ Church.

See the flyer on Page 5 reminding us that, on **Reconciliation Monday**, March 25, Confessions will be heard in HNJ Church from 2-4 p.m. and 6-9 p.m.. Please make a good Confession before the end of Lent.

Also, please see the item on Page 2 about **The Way of the Cross by the Streets** that will begin in front of HNJ Church at 10 a.m. on Good Friday, March 29. Please join us if you can.

Progress has been slow on the **2024 Annual Catholic Appeal**. As of March 18, pledges total only \$21,097, which is far short of the goal of \$55,623 assigned to us by the Diocese. Please use the pledge envelopes you received in the mail or the on-line donation process to make your 2024 ACA pledge as part of your Lenten almsgiving.

There will be more about Holy Week and the Triduum below, but here I want continue to draw your attention to the following two events that will come up quickly after Easter:

1. On Saturday, April 20, the **Diocesan Eucharistic Revival** will take place at the Louis Armstrong Stadium (an in-door venue) next to Citi Field in Queens. Admission is free, but seating is limited and tickets are required. We almost certainly will get a bus. Further details will be forthcoming, but, if you are considering attending, please provide the Rectory office (as soon as possible) with your name, email address, phone number and whether or not you would be interested in going by parish bus. This information will enable us to obtain the necessary number of tickets.
2. On Sunday, May 19, we will celebrate the **10th Anniversary of the Restoration of HNJ Church and the 145th Anniversary of the Parish Founding**. Bishop James Massa will preside at a Noon Mass of Thanksgiving followed by a celebration in Shepherds Hall and the School Yard. We hope that as many parishioners as possible (including our newer and former parishioners, and friends of HNJ parish) will attend both the Mass and the celebration. The flyer is on Facebook. Please spread the word as widely as possible. Tickets will be \$60 per adult; children 18 and under are free. This will cover the cost of food, beverages and entertainment. There will be more details about this important day after Holy Week. However, you can begin signing up to attend using Eventbrite or by providing the Rectory Office with your check, your name, phone number, email address, number of adults attending, and the names of the attendees.

The **Sacred Triduum** consists of the three 24-hour days beginning on the evening of Holy Thursday

and ending on the evening of Easter Sunday. Our complete **Holy Week schedule** (including the Triduum) is on Page 6. Please try to attend as many of these liturgies as possible. Please also consider the following commentary on the Triduum:

“What is the Triduum?”

Although Catholics are known for their obligatory holy days (such as All Saints' Day or the Feast of the Assumption), some of the most significant events on the church calendar come with no obligation attached. Among these are the ones that come at the end of Holy Week known as the Triduum, a Latin term meaning “a space of three days.”

The biblical significance of three consecutive days is that of gestation and rebirth: Think Jonah's three days in the belly of the fish and how it changes his mind about his mission. The ancients viewed three as a perfect number: totality epitomized by the prime alliance of the Trinity. No wonder Saint Paul identifies a trinity of virtues—faith, hope, and love—as the essence of Christian living.

In the Easter Triduum we who put our hope in Christ celebrate our rebirth into eternal life. The Triduum is comprised of three commemorative events celebrated as a single act of liturgy continued over three days: the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening. In common usage, however, the Masses of Easter Sunday are included as an extension of the Triduum commemoration.

Throughout these high holy days we first recall the events of the Last Supper: the institution of the Eucharist as well as its obligation of discipleship, ritualized by the washing of feet. Enough Eucharistic bread is consecrated on Holy Thursday to last until the third day when we celebrate the Easter Vigil. The tabernacle is then emptied of its precious contents, reserved elsewhere with proper adoration. The Table of the Lord is also stripped bare.

At the Good Friday service the Passion of Jesus is recounted from the Gospel of John and the cross is venerated in a special way by the whole assembly: kissing, touching, bowing. The reserved Eucharist is distributed but no Mass is celebrated on the day we recall the Crucifixion.

After dark on the third day we light the fire of Easter and proclaim “Christ our Light” with a magnificent extended scriptural reading of the highlights of salvation history, culminating with the gospel account of the Resurrection. On this joyful night the church receives new members in the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and first Eucharist. During the Vigil we also welcome Christian candidates for full communion with the Catholic Church. The big word of the evening says it all: Alleluia!” (Alice Camille, Prepare the Word)
