A NOTE FROM FR. LARRY

ROSARY FOR PEACE IN HOLY NAME CHURCH AT 12:15 PM THIS SUNDAY, APRIL 26, 2026

In last week's Bulletin, I quoted from Pope Leo's Reflection at his Prayer Vigil for Peace on April 11, 2026. I also quoted from the brief response by U.S. Conference of Bishops' President Archbishop Paul Coakley to President Trump's April 12 social media post that was critical of the Pope's Reflection.

On April 15, 2026, Brooklyn Bishop Robert Brennan issued a letter touching upon the Pope's and the President's interaction about peace. Bishop Brennan makes clear that "The Pope speaks not as a politician, but as a pastor, as one who seeks not to win arguments, but rather to heal wounds." Please read Bishop Brennan's letter printed in full on Page 5 in this bulletin. The Pope had invited Catholics around the world to join him in praying the Rosary for peace. In his letter, Bishop Brennan says he will be doing that this Sunday morning, April 26, at St. Joseph's Co-Cathedral. **This Sunday, I will also lead a Rosary for Peace here in Holy Name of Jesus Church after the 11 a.m. Family Mass (approximately 12:15 p.m.). It will be livestreamed, but please join us in person if you can.**

FEDERAL SCHOLARSHIP TAX CREDIT; IMMEDIATE ACTION REQUESTED

Important: Please read and act on this:

The Federal Government has enacted a law that gives every taxpayer the opportunity to receive a credit of up to \$1,700 on their Federal income taxes each year. Note that this is a credit—a one-to-one dollar reduction in Federal taxes—which is much more valuable than a deduction. You can receive that credit if you redirect up to \$1,700 of what you must already pay in taxes to a "scholarship granting" organization (like the Brooklyn Diocese's Futures in Education) which in turn can use that money for scholarships to Brooklyn's Catholic schools. You can direct your tax dollars to help Catholic schools with no increase to your Federal tax bill.

The Federal Government has already enacted the **Federal Scholarship Tax Credit** into law, but each state governor must "opt-in" to enable the taxpayers in that state to take advantage of it. This is a critical opportunity for Catholic schools and families across Brooklyn and Queens. The Brooklyn Diocese is asking for our immediate assistance, and the NYS State Catholic Conference is urging

all constituents to email Governor Hochul in strong support of New York opting into the Federal Scholarship Tax Credit. It is essential that she hears—clearly and repeatedly—that families, educators, and Catholic communities across New York want this opportunity.

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY & WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Concerning World Day of Prayer for Vocations, the USCCB reminds us that "The purpose of this day is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, 'Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest' (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). Please pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, societies of apostolic life or secular institutes."

Concerning Good Shepherd Sunday, please know that I remain very grateful for the opportunity given to me fairly late in my life to serve you, the lay faithful, as a priest. Please pray for all priests during these challenging times. †

FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH THE WORKER

MAY 1

To foster deep devotion to St. Joseph among Catholics, and in response to the "May Day" celebrations for workers sponsored by Communists, Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of St. Joseph the Worker in 1955. This feast extends the long relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers in both Catholic faith and devotion. Beginning in the Book of Genesis, the dignity of human work has long been celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in Genesis to care for the earth ([Gn 2:15](#)) and to be productive in their labors. Saint Joseph, the carpenter and foster father of Jesus, is but one example of the holiness of human labor.

Jesus, too, was a carpenter. He learned the trade from St. Joseph and spent his early adult years working side-by-side in Joseph's carpentry shop before leaving to pursue his ministry as preacher and healer. In his encyclical *Laborem Exercens*, Pope John Paul II stated: "the Church considers it her task always to call attention to the dignity and rights of those who work, to condemn situations in which that dignity and those rights are violated, and to help to guide [social] changes so as to ensure authentic progress by man and society."



St. Joseph is held up as a model of such work. Pius XII emphasized this when he said, "The spirit flows to you and to all men from the heart of the God-man, Savior of the world, but certainly, no worker was ever more completely and profoundly penetrated by it than the foster father of Jesus, who lived with Him in closest intimacy and community of family life and work."

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St. Joseph has two feast days: May 1 is the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker, the Patron of our aligned Catholic Academy. The Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is celebrated on March 19 each year.

Dear Friends,

From the beginning of his pontificate, which began nearly a year ago, our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, has spoken consistently a message of peace, respect for all human life, and dignity of all people. Taking on the role of St. Peter, he is bold, joyful, and unapologetic in the proclamation of the Gospel. As I am writing this, the Pope's current apostolic voyage to Africa is, itself, primarily a mission of peace.

The Holy Father speaks not as a politician, but as a pastor, as one who seeks not to win arguments, but rather to heal wounds. He promotes the Gospel of Jesus Christ, not a political agenda.

Pope Leo's unwavering commitment to promoting peace and dignity for all people is truly inspiring. His actions and words serve as a powerful reminder of the importance of dialogue and compassion in a world that often faces conflict and division. The invitation to unite in prayer reflects a profound trust in the power of community and spiritual solidarity to bring about positive change.

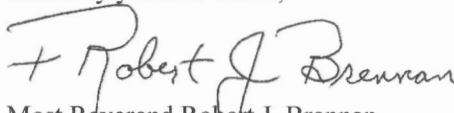
Speaking to journalists on his way to Africa he said, "I continue to speak strongly against war, seeking to promote peace, dialogue and multilateralism among states to find solutions to problems. Too many people are suffering today, too many innocent lives have been lost, and I believe someone must stand up and say there is a better way." He continued, "I say this to all world leaders, not only to him, [President Trump]: let us end wars and promote peace and reconciliation."

Recall Pope Leo's very first words spoken on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica: "Peace be with you." Those were Jesus' first words to the Apostles after his resurrection. This call for peace shapes his service as the successor of Saint Peter, the leader of Catholics throughout the world. But the Holy Father speaks not only with words, but with the witness of his life as a missionary. As pastor of the Universal Church, his message should be heard and respected.

On the Saturday after Easter, the Holy Father invited the faithful across the globe to join him in praying the Rosary with the intention of peace. He noted many conflicts around the world and called on all leaders of nations to work for peace.

As Catholics, and following his example, our response is to unite in prayer and seek to heal wounds. In his name, I invite the Church in Brooklyn and Queens to offer a special intention for peace on Sunday, April 26, 2026. I will pray the Rosary at the Co-Cathedral of St. Joseph at 10:30AM, before the 11:00AM Diocesan Pro Vita (Respect Life) Mass. I welcome you most heartily to join us in person or through NET TV, on that day or at least to offer some special prayer in solidarity with our Holy Father.

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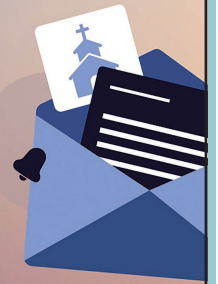
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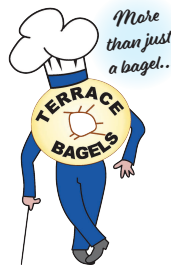
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
